





All possible infrastructural support is made available for the faculty members for research work. They are encouraged to undertake minor/major research projects funded by UGC/ICHR/ICSSR.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

A rich library with internet facility, an E-library, wi-fi enabled secured Campus (with CCTV), language-lab, intercom facility- all contribute to a health academic environment on the Campus.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

1. The faculty members and support staff work in a coordinated manner to optimize positive learning outcome for the students.

2.Faculty members are encouraged to engage in interdisciplinary academic activities, that facilitates teaching/learning process also by compensating for the dearth of teachers.

3. Apart from engaging regular assigned classes, faculty members are encouraged to participate and make academic contribution in the activities of Vocational &Self-financed Courses.

4.Service and experience of almost all teachers are utilized by ensuring their participation as members of different Committees/ Sub-Committees in the College.
