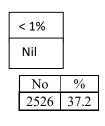

### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- Admission through online system for regular UG courses and merit-based admission to PG courses help in ascertaining the 'entry level competence' of the students.
- Mid-term & Sent-up tests and CIA have also been introduced from 2014 onwards.

### 6.3.4 Research and Development

- All possible infrastructural support is made available for the faculty members for research work. They are encouraged to undertake minor/major research projects funded by UGC/ICHR/ICSSR.
- Some of the faculty members have completed Minor Research Projects.
- PG students are also encouraged to take up research projects/ research assignments and present Papers in College/ Departmental Seminars

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

A rich library with internet facility, an E-library, Wi-Fi enabled secured Campus (with CCTVs), language-lab, intercom facility- all contribute to a health academic environment on the Campus. There is a well-equipped (CCTVs and public address system) Examination Hall with powerbackup.
